TOOLS FOR GROWTH IN TODAY'S CHANGING CLIMATE OF JOB INSTABILITY

Even though work is but one part of our lives, it is high on the ladder of importance and your time is valuable. Following are some tools to help you navigate the waters of employment and career advancement (while keeping your sanity).

IF YOU ARE OUT OF A JOB COMPLETELY & SEEKING EMPLOYMENT:

NETWORK, NETWORK, NETWORK!

- Take advantage of offerings and events within your field such as professional associations like PANJ, town hall meetings and social events. Many local law firms host dinner events with speaking engagements at no cost, so check out some firms you are interested in working for.
- Stay active and up to date on social media, especially LinkedIn (always keep it professional); follow firms you like and utilize free resources available on sites such as Career Builder and Glassdoor.
- Check with former co-workers, colleagues and friends who have recently changed
 jobs and find what avenues worked for them: websites, recruiting firms, etc. Treat
 every encounter (even conversation) as a possible future opportunity.
- Be selective as to what you are applying for, especially at first because you never really know who is going to "bite". Don't waste your time on anything that is less than desirable. Stay focused on what you really want.
- **Use your time productively**, focus on and develop your strengths and refresh your skills (check out the NJ Unemployment office, public libraries and http://www.njstatelib.org/ for more information).

IF YOU ARE CURRENTLY EMPLOYED BUT SEEKING BETTER OPPORTUNITY:

- Work hard! Don't give up on the job you already have; show initiative by asking for new responsibilities and opportunities to grow within the Company. It will show your dedication and commitment to the team. Always try to assist where needed - and show your added value to the Company.
- Seek a mentor. If you don't already have one, get one! Ideally, seek out someone whose career you admire and find out what they did to get there.

- Remember who you are and the image you project. Always look the part (eye contact is essential).
- **Don't quit until you have secured employment.** There is no telling how long your search could last. Remember, you will have to explain all gaps in employment to a future employer (and/or recruiting company).
- Leave on good terms. Maintain strong relationships with past and current bosses, colleagues and professors.
- Keep learning the journey never ends! Show initiative by staying updated on the
 ever-changing law and continue to polish your technical skills. Focus on and develop
 your strengths. Stay involved in other projects that you enjoy as well, such as reading
 for fun.
- Always keep your resume fresh and up to date. Update it often and immediately after
 you've taken a workshop or continuing education seminar (so you don't forget).
 Additionally, it may be time to eliminate some of your old job history (i.e. that summer
 gig at the Burrito Barn) or create different versions of your resume. Make sure to include
 your accomplishments and notable improvements within your existing role.
- Stay positive! Avoid the urge to gossip or talk poorly of your current employer NO ONE LIKES A DEBBIE DOWNER! If you are unhappy in your current situation, use your energy towards meeting your goal! Negativity and complaining will only bring you down and de-rail you from your objective - finding a new job and/or bettering your career.
- Use reputable staffing agencies, as closely related to your field as possible. There are
 many perks to using a recruiting firm (such as Lorelei Staffing) for resume assistance and
 interview preparation tools, as well as benefitting from their established client
 relationships. Also remember to use reputable job search sites as well. Indeed and Zip
 Recruiter are industry favorites.
- Remember, you are marketing your own product YOU! So be sure to stay on top of your game ALWAYS - your image presents itself before anything else; have your interview clothes pressed and ready to go.
- Always maintain your word. If you've recently met up with someone and offered your card, phone call or resume, follow through.

INTERVIEW TIPS

- Be yourself! Remember, they need you too!
- Always prepare by researching the Firm/Company to which you are applying. Bring a
 hard copy resume SPECIFIC TO THE JOB FOR WHICH YOU ARE APPLYING. Additionally,

if you have a job description, mirror your resume to match the skills they are seeking (again, be prepared to explain any employment gaps, it's fine if you have a "story", just be prepared to explain it).

- Always look your very best your image speaks before you do. A firm handshake and eye contact are a must, but avoid handshake extremes.
- Be prepared for "tricky" interview questions, i.e. Why are you leaving? Good answers include "I've been interested in working for your Company for years", "I would love to expand upon my existing skills and have plateaued at XYZ".
- Send a thank you note to ALL interviewers and don't be afraid to follow up if you haven't heard anything in a few weeks, you deserve a response. If you aren't offered the position, keep your spirits up, sometimes things happen for a reason!

In closing, it is always important to maintain balance in your life. If you are nervous or worried about your employment situation, you may be neglecting your physical and emotional health. Always schedule in some down-time for activities you enjoy (such as yoga, walking or meditation) to help unwind your mind and de-stress.
