

NALA 2016 CONVENTION RECAP JULY 13-15, 2016 PARIS HOTEL, LAS VEGAS, NEVADA



I was very excited to attend my first NALA convention. From my perspective it was a huge success. In fact, several people commented to me that it was the largest attended conference to date.



Continental breakfast was provided each morning, a brown bag lunch was available for pre-purchase one day; lunch buffet was provided one day and evening receptions were held three days, including Tuesday which was just an early day for registration and Friday, which was the board member installation. There were no seminars or exhibitors on Tuesday. The receptions each night were light and sociable providing opportunities for attendees to get to know each other, discuss the convention as a whole or particular seminars and to just socialize. There obviously were plenty of additional venues available to continue to socialize away from the convention.

Judge Jackie Glass (Ret.) was the keynote speaker this year. She was a litigator for 18 years, a Nevada District Court Judge for 8 years and starred in her own courtroom television show. Judge Glass presided over O.J. Simpson's armed robbery trial in Nevada and sentenced him to 33 years in prison. Since 2012 she has been handling dispute resolutions. Judge Glass gave insight to her professional careers and touched upon her O.J. trial - how it was assigned to her in the normal case assignment rotation (she didn't want it, but other judges did) and the need to keep the trial from getting out of the control given the media, the crowds, etc.

I attended Legal Project Management and Anti-Money Laundering Compliance sessions, as well as the technology sessions: The Top 10 Apps for Paralegals, Technology and Ethics and Using Technology to Implement Systems, Eliminate Disruptions and Maximize Quality Work Product.

There was so much to go over in the Legal Project Management seminar. Ms. Mitchell/Mercer explained the various steps of a project's life cycle – Objectives and Scopes, Project planning, executing the Plan, Monitoring Progress and Post Project Review – and then the budgeting. Ms. Mitchell/Mercer stressed the importance of short, daily scrum meetings to keep everyone focused and on task for successful project management.

Kacy Drury gave an overview of money laundering, what it is, ways in which it is accomplished and she went into the various anti-money laundering laws and their history, and the necessary forms filed with the overseeing agencies. Did you know how easy it is to launder money in Vegas? (ha ha ha)

The technology sessions were presented by Kenneth Berger, Esq., a South Carolina Plaintiff's PI attorney. The sessions mostly turned out to be lively discussions on the various applications and software paralegals use across the Country to get their jobs done. Pros and cons were shared and problem-solving solutions were provided by attendees for app/software issues as well as non-technology issues.

Mr. Berger's apps included apps used by his office, some free and most inexpensive. Some of his apps were geared towards PI, but others were TinyScanner, Adobe Fill and Sign, IJuror, AgileLaw, TimeMaster, Clio, TabLit Trial Notebook, TrialPad, Asana. Mr. Berger touched upon the RPCs which guide attorneys and paralegals with respect to safeguarding and maintaining client's electronic records and files and an attorney's duty to be tech compliant and competent. In cloud computing, Mr. Berger stressed to confirm sites being used are HIPPA compliant, FERPA compliant, etc.

I attended the roundtable affiliates exchange luncheon on Wednesday. There were about 10 of us at the table including NALA's Affiliates Association Director Jane McKinnon. The discussions were general about operating the association, holding CLE meetings or luncheons and the challenge of getting and keeping members and board members and publishing newsletters.
