Adoption Criteria-

Please, review the following adoption criteria of the Hound Haven Training Center and Rescue.

Your home must provide a safe environment where the dog will be cared for humanely, including adequate food, water, veterinary care, and shelter from weather. The dog must be licensed in accordance with the laws of your jurisdiction. The dog should be exercised in a fenced yard or on a leash. OUR RESCUES SHOULD NEVER BE ALLOWED TO RUN LOOSE and will be microchipped for identification before they leave our care. We will be listed as a permanent contact on all dogs and the adoptive home will be the secondary contact. They will always need to carry i.d. tags.

You must not have ever been convicted of animal cruelty, neglect, or abandonment.

Bloodhounds will only be placed in private homes. The adopted Bloodhound/hound may not be used for medical or other experimental purposes. Bloodhounds are best kept in close proximity to their families. They should never be chained or tied-out.

HHTC& Rescue should not be used as an inexpensive source for obtaining a Bloodhound. Rescue dogs will be spayed/neutered prior to placement. If this is not possible due to age or health conditions, the dog must be either returned to HHTC& Rescue at the proper time for this procedure or if because of distance, proof from your local veterinarian must be supplied to the rescue within the given time. Hound Haven Training Center and Rescue offers lifetime training support for our rescues. We have a dedicated Facebook page for our adoptive parents with resources for training, enrichment ideas and other related resources. We also offer local training support or virtual training support for our adoptive families. We feel that having the ongoing training support will make for more successful placements and stronger bonds with the dogs and their families. We are a positive-reinforcement training facility and start all our rescues with this method to help them start to trust. We will provide education to our new adoptive families on this training and require all our rescues continue with this type of training. Adopted hounds will not be subjected to the use of aversive training methods and devices: e-collars, prong collars, choke chains, slip leads.

The adoption fee charged by Hound Haven Training Center and Rescue is \$400 for puppies up to 1 year old, \$350.00 for 1 -3-year-old, and \$250 for ages 4 and up. The fee is charged to help with the expenses incurred by HHTC& Rescue for veterinary services, transportations, grooming, etc. If, for whatever reason, the adoption does not work to the advantage of the family and/ or dog, the adopted Bloodhound/ Hound must be returned to Hound Haven Training Center and Rescue. You may not for any reason transfer ownership of the adopted Bloodhound. It is understood that HHTC & Rescue reserves the right to follow-up on the placement of the dog to ensure the dog's well-being. It is understood that a HHTC & Rescue representative may examine and inquire about the adopted dog at any time, and if not satisfied with the condition of the dog, or the conditions in which it is living, the dog may be reclaimed by Hound Haven Training Center and Rescue immediately. If legal action becomes necessary to reclaim the dog, the adoptive owners will be responsible for all legal fees and court costs incurred by Hound Haven Training Center and Rescue.

It is agreed and understood that Hound Haven Training Center and Rescue, its volunteers, and others working for and or associated with, shall not be responsible for any damage or injury caused by a Bloodhound/Hound placed through HHTC& Rescue. Every effort is made by the Hound Haven Training Center and Rescue staff to evaluate and test the stability of the Bloodhound/Hound before placement but there is no guarantee.

I HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE THAT I HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THE ABOVE CRITERIA, AND I WILL COMPLY.

All of the information I have given in this document is true and complete. Should a Bloodhound be placed in my home it will reside in my home as a pet. I agree to provide the dog with adequate food, water, shelter, affection, and medical care. I understand the temperament, habits, and physical condition of the dogs available for adoption have been screened but cannot be guaranteed.

Also, that Hound Haven Training Center and Rescue is in no way liable or responsible for any damage, accident/injury resulting from the placement of a dog into my home.
